"SSV: Step Up & Stop it !" is an educational tool, created on the initiative of the Diversity and Inclusion Chair Inclusion Chair, led by Professor Hager Jemel, to help in the fight against gender-based and sexual violence (SGBV) in the student environment.

Created for workshop use, this device is a deck of cards designed to educate, raise awareness, and train students effectively in line with their real-world experiences.

Drawing from legal definitions, realistic scenarios, statistics, and practical tools, the toolkit aids in recognizing key forms of SGBV, connecting them to tangible situations, analyzing the evidence, and equipping individuals with the means to respond to SGBV.

Training in the use of this tool has been created to guarantee the ability to facilitate workshops in the best possible conditions and to provide additional knowledge.



TRAINING OBJECTIVES

- **1 Identify and recognize** 9 forms of SGBV.
- **2 Estimate the extent of SGBV** using figures and statistics.
- 3 Learn how to react appropriately to SGBV situations.
- 4 Provide an opportunity to speak out on a subject often avoided or trivialized.
